Nuclear fission fragments spectroscopy

Two schools: High fold studies / fission fragments identification



 \checkmark Lot of statistics available with high folds (fold \geq 3) Require a minimal knowledge of the nucleus \mathbf{K} Complicated analysis to avoid bad γ -ray attribution

Target: ${}^{9}\text{Be} \sim 10 \mu \text{m}$ Recoil velocities: $\beta \sim 0.1$ → Validation rate: ~ 1.5 kHz

Introduction Experimental setup The AGATA Gamma Tracking Array Continuous sphere of segmented HGPe crystals → High energy resolution → High efficiency Full digital electronic: High counting rates capabilities

Position resolution of interaction points ~ 5mm

Tracking of the γ-ray path in the crystals
Increased peak to background ratio
Very precise Doppler Correction
